Additionally, they are also getting ready to release the trout they raised from eggs. We are very proud of our participation in this initiative.

Dressing for Warmer Weather

As temperatures begin to warm-up please be sure your children are dressing in a manner that is healthy, safe, and conducive to student learning. The school system has a dress code (policy 9210) that does not allow: tank tops with spaghetti straps, halter tops, tops that are strapless, low cut, or expose the midriff; pants worn low or loose that expose skin

or undergarments, hats, hoods, bandanas and other head coverings (except for a religious belief). Please be sure shorts and skirts are long enough so students can comfortably sit without exposing too much skin. For safety, we highly recommend sneakers/tennis shoes or shoes with straps. Flip flops are not safe for the school environment. Additionally, as temperatures warm up, the air conditioning system will be turned on. Students should keep a sweatshirt or sweater in their backpacks since temperatures often fluctuate across the school.
